

Entonces los discípulos se acordaron de la Escritura que dice: "Me consumirá el celo por tu casa." Los publos le preguntaron a Jesús: ¿Qué prueba nos das de tu autoridad para hacer esto?" Mientras Jesús estaba en Jerusalén, en la fiesta de la Pascua, muchos creveron en Jesús al ver las señales milagrosas que hacía. Pero Jesús no confiaba en ellos, porque los conocía a todos. No necesitaba que nadie le dijera nada acerca de la gente, pues Jesús mismo conocía el corazón de la humanidad.

The Passover of the people was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple Jesus found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money-changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, Jesus drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. Jesus also poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables and told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! Stop making God's house a marketplace!" The disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." The people then said to Jesus, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." The people then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" But Jesus was speaking of the temple of his body. After Jesus was raised from the dead, the disciples remembered that Jesus had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken. When Jesus was in Jerusalem during the Passover festival, many believed in Jesus' name because they saw the signs that Jesus was doing. But Jesus would not confide in them, because Jesus knew all people and needed no one to testify about anyone; for Jesus knew what was in everyone.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION PROGRAM: Spiritual Direction is a process in which a mentor accompanies one person - the directee - for an extended period of time. Through conversation, prayer, and spiritual exercises, the mentor helps the directee clarify spiritual issues so that s/he can move toward a deeper experience with the Divine.
